During 2017-18 SAASVHAC has continued to actively consult with their members (1572 volunteers) and work closely with SAAS to ensure that the needs and priorities of the SAAS Volunteer sector are considered in the provision of ambulance services to country South Australia.

SAASVHAC has been involved in the discussion of the future restructure of Country Operations through the SAAS Strategic Working Group during this process SAASVHAC supported the extra funding via Country Operating Reserve Fund for additional resources to improve volunteer training. These resources include six additional training ambulances, once for each country region and the introduction of training courses available on an electronic platform, allowing easy and readable access to training materials. It also facilitates streamlined processing and marking of student's course material whilst meeting requirements for Regional Training Organisation compliance and record keeping.

Volunteers now have access to a SAAS provided email to improve communication and information sharing, including clinical notices, policies and procedures. Whilst the uptake by volunteers to use this format has been slow we are gradually seeing a small growth each month and have implemented strategies to help increase participation.

Improvements to recruitment and selection processes, has seen an increase in the number of volunteers recruited and also a small increase in their retention. SAASVHAC, with SAAS are continually improving reward and recognition programs to be used in appreciation for SAAS volunteers, which will assist in their retention.

While the changes to the training system have been implemented, this has not as yet reached its full potential which has been caused by a number of factors, including loss of key personnel, which has stalled the implementation of education materials and secondly the lack of personal resource to be able to develop the course material in a timely manner.

SAASVHAC has made strong representation to both SAAS Strategic Working Group and the Minister for Health and Wellbeing to assist with building community resilience.

The question of volunteer sustainability has been an ongoing discussion within SAASVHAC. There are many challenges that are currently being faced in rural communities. SAASVHAC believe if provided with the right support and resources and ongoing reviews of the country service delivery model, volunteering with SAAS could be sustained.
